Civil society engagement in policy and budget processes and holding governments accountable for advancing gender equality is of paramount importance. Civil society organizations (CSOs) voice the different needs of women and men, boys and girls and act as watchdogs of the management and the distribution of public finances for the different needs of women and men. Their work in times of pandemic is even more relevant, particularly in development of emergency and resilience response. CSOs must be trusted partners of governments (local and central) in averting negative effects.

The international conference **Role of civil society in (gender responsive) budgeting: participation, advocacy and accountability** is a joint event organized by the Gender Budget Watchdog Network of civil society organizations, UN Women and the International Budget Partnership. The event is organized in the framework of the Center for Research and Policy Making (CRPM) project "Gender Budget Watchdog Network of CSOs in Western Balkans and the Republic of Moldova", financed by Austrian Development Agency and Sweden; and the UN Women projects "Transformative Financing for Gender Equality Towards More Transparent, Inclusive and Accountable Governance in the Western Balkans" financed by Sweden, and "Promoting Gender Responsive Policies and Budgets: Towards Transparent, Inclusive and Accountable Governance in the Republic of North Macedonia", financed by Switzerland and Sweden.

<b>16:30- 18:00</b>	<p><b>Workshop on methodologies – parallel sessions</b></p> <p><b>WORKSHOP 1   Budget credibility</b> is a challenge that impacts many low- and middle-income countries, where deviations from the planned budget mean that governments also deviate from their stated priorities for public spending. This session will explore how civil society can examine budget credibility issues for government spending on sectors that are central to achieving the SDGs and contextualize these issues alongside country-level progress in achieving SDG targets.</p> <p><b>WORKSHOP 2   Empowering marginalized communities</b> in the budget process can be critical for uncovering and addressing service delivery gaps and enabling transformational change. This session will explore how to build the budget knowledge and skills of marginalized groups and movements by linking them with budget organizations in order to expose fiscal causes and build effective budget advocacy, with a focus on efforts to promote greater awareness, analysis, and advocacy around gender issues that result from governments underdelivering on critical services.</p> <p><b>WORKSHOP 3   Covid-19 demonstrated that resilience response must be gendered to prevent for greater or new gender inequalities to emerge.</b> The role of CSOs in watching how the resilience response is planned and executed and what impact it has on gender equality is paramount. This session will introduce the CSOs to the methods and tools for assessing timeliness of the measures and the budget adopted for resilience response; to assess the gender-responsiveness and transparency of the measures, as well as the level of participation of civil society organizations.</p>
